Also to be promoted more vigorously in the coming year is the Maths Active Schools program. As before, this will be handled by Jurek Paradowski.



ATSIMA, the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Mathematics Alliance, is the 'national network' that was recommended by a Blueprint released in April and which was the subject of consultation symposiums around the country over recent months. It is intended to enable strategic collaboration among all those keen to make a difference in Aboriginal young peoples learning of mathematics – teachers, researchers, communities, education authorities, business and industry.




PUZZLE


